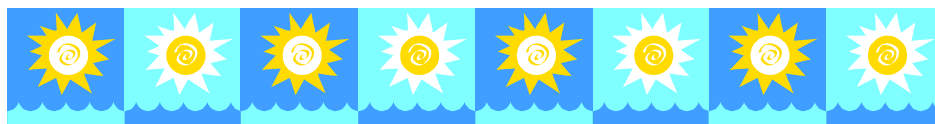

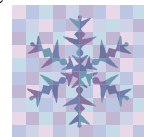


WITASWAN Movie Club

AAUW National Convention Recap

Almost 1,000 AAUW members attended the 2009 National Convention in St. Louis, MO on June 26-29, 2009. There were 95 Illinois delegates. (See above picture.) The convention halls and sessions were full women and some men from all across the country representing states, branches, members at large and partner organizations all focused on breaking through barriers for women and girls.

Lisa Maatz, AAUW Public Policy director, fired up the “Teal Machine” and urged all of us to call our state representatives and fill their voice mails by encouraging them to sign on to the Paycheck Fairness Act. Lisa then introduced Lilly Ledbetter, the face of pay equity, as the keynote speaker on Friday afternoon. It was a powerful experience to see and hear Lilly. Her case against Goodyear Tire went all the way to the Supreme Court, was then ruled against. She has yet to see any money in her wage discrimination case. In January 2009, the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act was the first bill that President Obama signed into law. AAUW has been a partner with Ms. Ledbetter for many years as she fought her pay equity cases.

On Saturday morning, our keynote speaker was Rep. Rose DeLauro (D-CT), who is currently serving her tenth term in Congress and sits on the influential House Appropriations and Budget Committee. Rep. DeLauro has worked diligently to pass the Fair Pay Act in the House after years of effort. She is continuing to persuade Senators to pass this bill as well. The whole audience was energized to hear her speak so passionately about women’s causes, what has been done and what work still needs to be done.

At the Convention Banquet on Saturday evening, the speaker was Rep. Jackie Speier (D-CA). Jackie is an AAUW member and another example of a strong woman fighting for women and girls in California and government. During the banquet, Illinois was honored as one of the top ten states for highest contributions to LAF, EF, Eleanor Roosevelt Fund, and the Leadership and Training Institute (LTI). We were proud to represent Illinois at the banquet and convention.

Attendees were able to attend a variety of workshops and panel discussions over the course of the weekend. But most of the conference revolved around the proposed bylaw changes. After many hours of discussion and business sessions over two days, the one member, one vote proposal did pass but the open membership bylaw did not pass. So we are under the same membership guidelines as before.

Members attending the convention thanked outgoing President Ruth Sweetser for her leadership over the past four years. Congratulations to the following new AAUW officers. 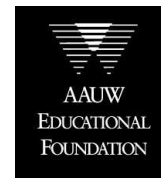
Legal Advocacy Fund Update

Public Policy Update Illinois Legislative Report - July 19, 2009

The good news is last Wednesday night the legislature finally came up with a budget for 2010. The bad news is that this budget may be the worse budget ever passed.

The budget has no income tax increase and includes:

- borrowing 3.2 billion dollars to fund the pensions required for state , K-12 and higher ed. employees
- delaying paying 3.5 billion dollars to vendors for the state in 2010
- requiring the Governor to cut 1 billion dollars from the budget passed
- requiring the state agencies to set aside 1.1 billion dollars in case there are not enough funds.

This budget may last the state for 5-7 months but few believe that this budget can get us through the 2010 budget year. President Cullerton of the Senate, stated in his remarks, that this budget has severe cuts that some have asked for and that in January they will need to look again at an income tax increase to make it through the rest of the year.

Human services, education grants, DNR grants and other funding will be cut. These cuts will be made by the Governor and Agency Directors. The presumption is that overall the cuts will be 86% from last year's budget BUT another 1.1 billion dollars must be held into reserve so the actual dollars available will be significantly less than 86%. We heard that the reason the cuts were not included in the budget like other years was because the leaders knew that they could not pass the budget if legislators saw the cuts. The legislative leaders are giving that nasty task to Governor Quinn.

Veto override session is scheduled for Oct. 14-16 and Oct. 28-30.

Presuming that the borrowing happens, the budget cuts and state employee layoffs occur, veto override will be the next time we come into session to visit the Governor's actions. I don't know how anyone plans to move forward this year with this pathetic budget but guess we will see how it works.

Many of us involved in the events of the Capitol did not think that things could get worse after the last several years. Unfortunately, this budget is much worse than any to date and next year's could be even more frustrating.
